Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: CIBC Global Bond Private Pool (referred to as the *Pool*) seeks to generate a high level of income and capital growth by investing in bonds and other fixed income securities anywhere in the world. The bonds must have a minimum rating of 'BBB' by DBRS Limited, or equivalent.

Investment Strategies: The Pool uses a multi-strategy approach to buying global fixed income securities with a focus on fundamentals, valuation, and market sentiment to determine value across countries, sectors and currencies. The Pool may employ a number of different strategies to buying bonds, debentures, notes and other debt obligations securities denominated in foreign currencies, of Canadian governments and companies, non-Canadian issuers and supranational organizations.

Risk

The Pool is a global fixed income fund that is suitable for medium to long term investors who can tolerate low to medium investment risk.

For the period ended August 31, 2023, the Pool's overall level of risk remains as discussed in the simplified prospectus.

Results of Operations

CIBC Asset Management Inc. (referred to as *CAMI*, the *Manager*, or *Portfolio Advisor*), Brandywine Global Investment Management, LLC (referred to as *Brandywine*) and PIMCO Canada Corp. (referred to as *PIMCO*) provide investment advice and investment management services to the Pool. The investment style and the percentage of the portfolio allocated to CAMI and these portfolio sub-advisors are outlined below. The portfolio allocation may change from time to time.

- Brandywine: Global Opportunistic, approximately 50%
- CAMI: Fixed Income Core and Currency, approximately 37.5%
- PIMCO: Global Diversified Credit, approximately 12.5%

The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the period ended August 31, 2023. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The Pool's net asset value decreased by 2% during the period, from \$451,704 as at August 31, 2022 to \$441,475 as at August 31, 2023. Net redemptions of \$13,859 and negative investment performance resulted in an overall decrease in net asset value.

Premium Class units of the Pool posted a return of -0.4% for the period. The Pool's benchmark, the FTSE World Government Bond Index (Hedged to CAD) (referred to as the *benchmark*), returned -1.7% for the same period. The Pool's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the benchmark's return. See the section *Past Performance* for the returns of other classes of units offered by the Pool.

Global fixed income markets were volatile over the period. While inflation began to moderate, it remained higher than central bank targets. Central banks attempted to manage inflation by raising interest rates, while investors came to accept that interest rates would likely remain higher for longer.

The U.S. dollar began to weaken in the fourth quarter of 2022, which benefited global currencies, particularly in emerging markets. However, the U.S. dollar began to slowly advance during the second quarter of 2023.

Market volatility intensified in March with the collapse of SVB Financial Group. The situation worsened when Credit Suisse Group AG was acquired by UBS Group AG in March. Concerns about further failures in the banking industry resulted in investors moving toward higher-quality investments, driving government bond yields sharply lower. Additionally, the U.S. Federal Reserve Board paused its interest-rate increases in June but made its intentions for further rate increases clear.

In the Pool's Global Opportunistic component, modestly longer duration (sensitivity to interest rates) in select emerging markets contributed to performance. Certain Latin and South American countries benefited from a weaker U.S. dollar and interest-rate increases. Exposure to U.S. agency mortgage-backed securities contributed to performance when mortgage rates rose. Moderate overweight exposure to the Colombian peso contributed to performance. The country continued to address its fiscal balance and record high inflation. Its currency also benefited from the U.S. dollar's decline. A holding in the Chilean peso contributed to

performance as the trade balance significantly improved and inflation began to moderate.

Certain duration positioning detracted from performance in the Global Opportunistic component as U.S. treasury yields rose in response to elevated inflation. U.S. treasuries detracted from performance as the component held a moderate overweight allocation versus the benchmark. A slight overweight allocation to the U.S. dollar detracted from performance as the currency began to weaken.

Brandywine added a slight overweight holding in the Indian rupee based on the country's improving growth and balance of payments. Overall duration was increased as certain areas of global government interest-rate markets became more attractive, in Brandywine's view, specifically in developed markets.

Brandywine eliminated a moderate overweight allocation to the euro. Despite the rise in interest rates, debt portfolio flows into Europe have not returned as expected. The component's Canadian duration was reduced as the labour market remained tight. The Bank of Canada indicated that it is near the end of its cycle of interest-rate increases. Coupled with weakening U.S. growth, this could lead to less supportive growth in Canada.

In the Pool's Fixed Income Core and Currency component, overweight exposure to U.S. dollar-denominated emerging markets debt, Colombian yields and Indonesian and South African bonds contributed to performance. Active currency management was another contributor to performance.

Some of the Fixed Income Core and Currency component's duration decisions detracted from performance. Other detractors from performance included underweight exposure to Italian and Chinese bonds and overweight exposure to U.K. bonds.

CAMI added new exposures in Chinese and South African bonds. An allocation to Colombian yield was eliminated. U.S. dollar-denominated emerging markets bond exposure was trimmed.

In the Pool's Global Diversified Credit component, European duration positioning contributed to performance as interest rates rose. Positioning within U.S. investment-grade credit, particularly in the industrials sector and through moderately overweight allocations to health care and information technology, contributed to performance. Tactical exposures to non-U.S. developed markets currencies and Canadian dollar positioning also contributed to performance.

Duration positioning in Canada detracted from performance in the Global Diversified Credit component as interest rates rose. Emerging market debt exposure and a moderate underweight allocation to select Latin American emerging markets detracted from performance as these securities outperformed.

PIMCO increased the component's exposures to the tobacco industry from slightly underweight to moderately overweight. Similarly, exposure to the automotive industry increased from moderately underweight to slightly overweight. PIMCO reduced exposure to the food and beverages industry segment from a moderately overweight allocation to a slight underweight allocation. Exposure to banking was also decreased.

Recent Developments

Effective April 27, 2023, Bryan Houston was appointed Chair of the Independent Review Committee.

Effective April 3, 2023, the Pool's name changed from Renaissance Global Bond Private Pool to CIBC Global Bond Private Pool, Class A units were closed to all purchases, Class SM units were created, and the annual management fee was reduced from 1.15% to 0.95% in respect of Premium Class units, Premium-T4 Class units, Premium-T6 Class units, and from 0.65% to 0.45% in respect of Class F-Premium units, Class F-Premium T4 units, Class F-Premium T6 units, Class N-Premium units, Class N-Premium T4 units and Class N-Premium T6 units of the Pool. Class A units were subsequently terminated on June 29, 2023.

The COVID-19 pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine war have disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. This has resulted in significant volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses and financial markets. Inflation has increased in many markets across the globe, leading central banks to raise interest rates in order to counter rapidly rising prices. These factors may adversely affect the performance of the Pool. The Manager continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Related Party Transactions

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (referred to as *CIBC*) and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the Pool, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor of the Pool

CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Pool's Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor. As Manager, CAMI receives management fees with respect to the Pool's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of each respective class of units of the Pool as described in *Management Fees*.

The Manager pays the Pool's operating expenses (other than certain Pool costs) in respect of the classes of units of the Pool (except Class O unit), which may include but are not limited to, operating and administrative costs; regulatory fees; audit, and legal fees and expenses; trustee, safekeeping, custodial, and any agency fees; and investor servicing costs and costs of unitholder reports, prospectuses, Fund Facts, and other reports, in exchange for the Pool paying a fixed rate administration fee (plus applicable GST/HST) to the Manager with respect to those classes of units. For Class O units, no fixed administration fee will be charged. The Manager pays the Pool's operating expenses (other than certain Pool costs) allocated to Class O units of the Pool. The fixed administration fee payable by the Pool, may, in any particular period, exceed or be lower than the expenses we incur in providing such services to the Pool.

As Trustee, CAMI holds title to the Pool's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its unitholders. As Portfolio Advisor, CAMI provides, or arranges to provide for, investment advice and portfolio management services to the Pool. CAMI also compensates dealers in connection

with their marketing activities regarding the Pool. From time to time, CAMI may invest in units of the Pool.

Distributor

Class C and I units of the Pool may be purchased only through CIBC Wood Gundy, a division of CIBC World Markets Inc. (referred to as *CIBC WM*). Other classes of units of the Pool may be purchased through dealers and other firms, including CAMI's related dealers such as the CIBC Investor's Edge discount brokerage division of CIBC Investor Services Inc. (referred to as *CIBC ISI*), the CIBC Imperial Service division of CIBC ISI, and CIBC WM. CIBC ISI and CIBC WM are wholly-owned subsidiaries of CIBC. CAMI may pay sales commissions and trailing commissions to the dealers in connection with the sale of units of the Pool. These dealers and other firms may pay a portion of these sales commissions and trailing commissions to their advisors who sell units of the Pool to investors.

Brokerage Arrangements and Soft Dollars

The Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisors make decisions, including the selection of markets and dealers and the negotiation of commissions, with respect to the purchase and sale of portfolio securities, certain derivative products and the execution of portfolio transactions. Brokerage business may be allocated by the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) to CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., each a subsidiary of CIBC. CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp. may also earn spreads on the sale of fixed income securities, other securities, and certain derivative products to the Pool. A spread is the difference between the bid and ask prices for a security in the applicable marketplace, with respect to the execution of portfolio transactions. The spread will differ based upon various factors such as the nature and liquidity of the security.

Dealers, including CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., may furnish goods and services, other than order execution, to the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) when they process trades through them. These types of goods and services for which the Portfolio Advisor or a portfolio sub-advisor may direct brokerage commissions are research goods and services and order execution goods and services, and are referred to in the industry as "soft-dollar" arrangements. These goods and services received through soft dollar arrangements assist the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) with investment decision-making services for the Pool, or relate directly to the execution of portfolio transactions on behalf of the Pool. As per the terms of the portfolio advisory agreement and portfolio sub-advisory agreements, such soft dollar arrangements are in compliance with applicable laws.

During the period, the Pool did not pay any brokerage commissions or other fees to CIBC WM or CIBC World Markets Corp. Spreads associated with fixed income and other securities are not ascertainable and, for that reason, cannot be included when determining these amounts.

Pool Transactions

The Pool may enter into one or more of the following transactions (referred to as the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the

standing instructions issued by the Independent Review Committee (referred to as the *IRC*):

- invest in or hold equity securities of CIBC or issuers related to a portfolio sub-advisor;
- invest in or hold non-exchange-traded debt securities of CIBC or an issuer related to CIBC, with terms-to-maturity of 365 days or more, issued in a primary offering and in the secondary market;
- make an investment in the securities of an issuer for which CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC (referred to as a *Related Dealer* or the *Related Dealers*) acts as an underwriter during the offering of the securities or at any time during the 60-day period following the completion of the offering of such securities (in the case of a "private placement" offering, in accordance with the Private Placement Relief Order and the policies and procedures relating to such investment);
- purchase equity or debt securities from, or sell them to, a Related Dealer, where it is acting as principal;
- undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where a related party is the counterparty;
- purchase securities from or sell securities to another investment fund or a managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate (referred to as *inter-fund trades* or *cross-trades*); and
- engage in in-specie transfers by receiving portfolio securities from, or delivering portfolio securities to, a managed account or another investment fund managed by the Manager or an affiliate, in respect of a purchase or redemption of units of the Pool, subject to certain conditions.

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred to or reported to it by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with conditions imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the custodian of the Pool (referred to as the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds cash and securities for the Pool and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash or securities that the Custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the Pool including record-keeping and processing foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for the services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company (referred to as *CIBC GSS*) provides certain services to the Pool, including securities lending, fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. Such servicing fees are paid by the Manager. CIBC indirectly owns a 50% interest in CIBC GSS.

Spreads associated with fixed income securities trading are not ascertainable and, for that reason, are not included in the trading expense ratio calculation.
- ⁸ The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the portfolio advisor and/or portfolio sub-advisor manages the portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to a fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by a fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. Management Fees

The Pool pays CAMI an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the Pool. Management fees are based on the net asset value of the Pool and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CAMI in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, office overhead expenses, trailing commissions, and the fees of the sub-advisors are paid by CAMI out of the management fees received from the Pool. The Pool is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CAMI. Refer to the simplified prospectus for the annual management fee rate for each class of units.

For Class O units, the management fee is negotiated with and paid by, or as directed by, unitholders or dealers and discretionary managers on behalf of unitholders. Such Class O management fee will not exceed the Class F-Premium unit management fee rate.

The following table shows a breakdown of the services received in consideration of the management fees, as a percentage of the management fees collected from the Pool for the period ended August 31, 2023. These amounts do not include waived fees or absorbed expenses.

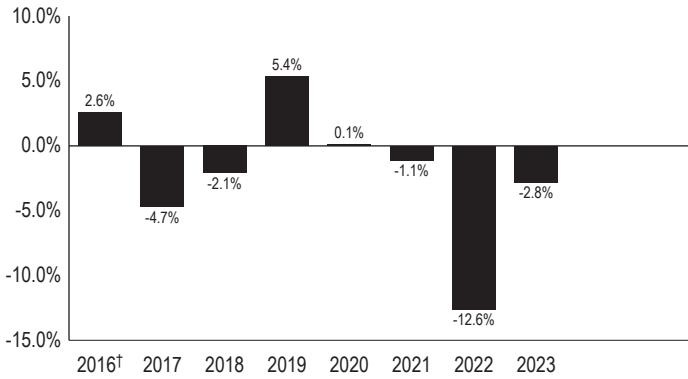

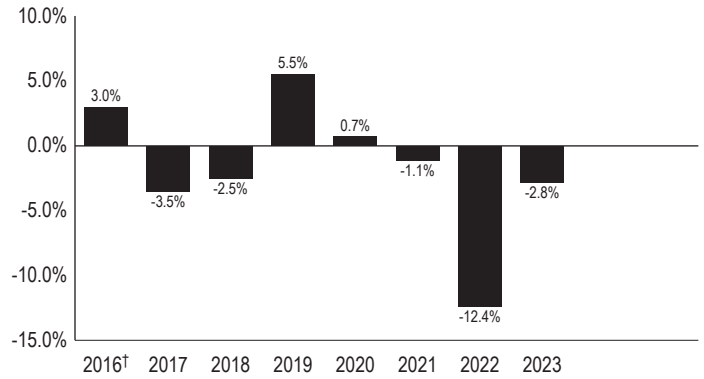


Class F-Premium T4 Units



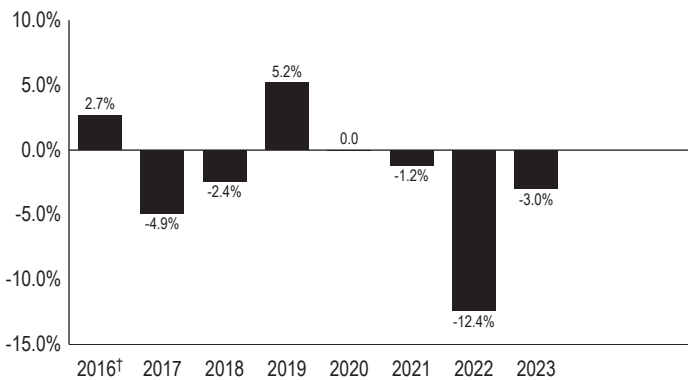

Class F-Premium T6 Units



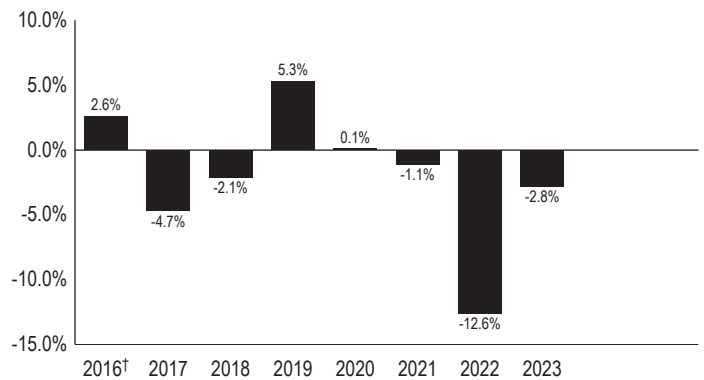

Class N-Premium Units



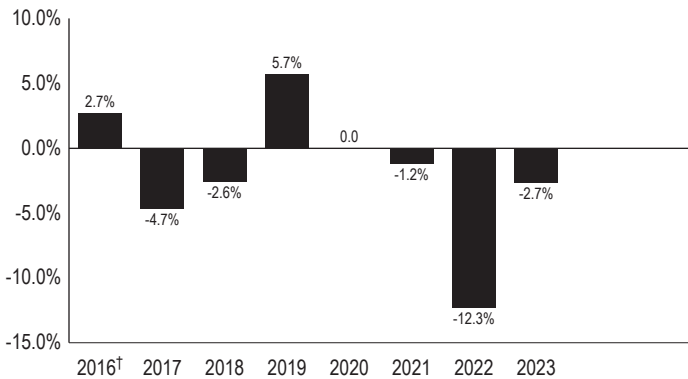

Class N-Premium T4 Units



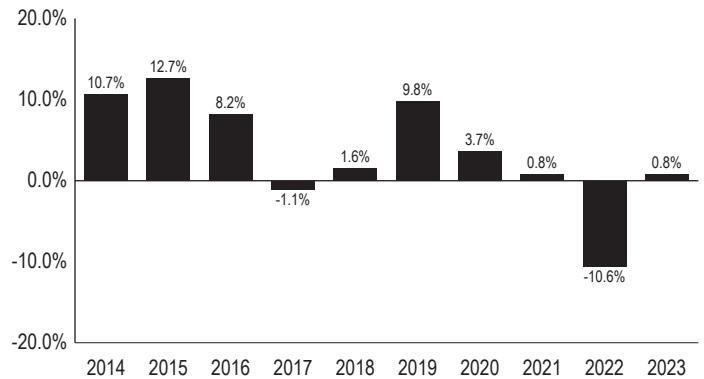
